In 2020, the ensemble was selected as Britten Pears Young Artists, and won first prize at the London International Festival of Early Music Young Ensemble Competition. In 2021, the ensemble became City Music Foundation artists, and released its debut album, The ensemble appears regularly on BBC Radio 3's Early Music Show and In Tune programmes.

It is a special pleasure to welcome the pianist, regular visitor, and one of our Patrons, ALASDAIR BEATSON. He champions a wide repertoire on both modern and historical instruments with particular areas of interest: classical, early romantic and French music (especially Fauré), alongside the music of today's composers. A prolific chamber musician, Alasdair's colleagues include Steven Isserlis, Viktoria Mullova, Pieter Wispelwey and the Nash Ensemble.

Recent recordings include works of Beethoven and Schubert for violin and fortepiano with Viktoria Mullova, and a solo piano recital *Aus Wien* on Pentatone. These join a discography of solo and chamber recordings. Performances during 2024 included regular appearances at Wigmore Hall, and at festivals including Bath Mozartfest, Ernen, and Lewes. For the first time, we welcome MIKELEIZ-ZUCCHI DUO. They are a London-based ensemble formed by Canadian saxophonist David Zucchi and Spanish accordionist Iñigo Mikeleiz-Berrade. Winners of the Royal Over-Seas League Annual Music Competition's Mixed Ensemble Prize and City Music Foundation Artists, the Mikeleiz-Zucchi Duo's repertoire spans everything from reimagined traditional works to modern repertoire and improvisation, all vividly rendered by the unique combination of saxophone and accordion.

After their debut concert at the Vale de Cambra Classical Music Festival (Portugal) in 2019, the duo has performed across the UK and Europe, including appearances at Wigmore Hall, Edinburgh Fringe, St Martin-inthe-Fields, Buxton International Festival, and St George's Bristol. They have appeared on BBC Radio 3's In Tune and were 2023 residents at Music at Brel (Roquecor, France). Individually, Iñigo and David have distinguished themselves as award-winning interpreters of classical, improvised, contemporary and experimental music.

Guildhall School of Music and Drama. Since then, they have delighted audiences with their distinctive instrumental combination and imaginative programming. The trio won the Elias Fawcett Award for Outstanding Chamber Ensemble at the 2012 Royal Overseas League Competition. They have been Live Music Now Artists and were awarded a Chamber Music Fellowship at the Guildhall School of Music & Drama in 2011. In 2017 they were selected as Kirckman Concert Society Artists.

They have been praised for the 'superb sense of ensemble between the players, and the impressive vitality of their playing' (Planet Hugill). They have appeared at numerous festivals and have performed live on BBC Radio 3's In Tune and toured France.

A warm welcome is extended to MITSU TRIO which was formed in 2020 by British pianist Tyler Hay, Japanese cellist Akito Goto and Catalan violinist Laura Custodio Sabas. All three members met at the Purcell School for Young Musicians when they were just teenagers, where they formed a strong musical connection. Aside from the vast standard repertoire for piano trio, the Mitsu Trio enjoy exploring less played composers, such as Czech composer Bohuslav Martinů and Brazilian composer Henrique Oswald, with on going plans of the trio's debut album with music of the latter. They are also strong advocates of contemporary music, having given the world premiere of Simon Speare's piano trio, and having held workshops with the young composers at the Purcell School for Young Musicians.

Patterns of Love is a programme of a cappella songs that explore the beauty, heartache, and humour of love. The trio's performance spans hundreds of years, from medieval up to the current day with music from 12th century Germany by Hildegard of Bingen, 13th century France, Shakespearean song, and folksong arrangements from the UK and Ireland. Including special commissions and new music by British composers Marcus Davidson, Liz Dilnot Johnson, Stevie Wishart, and Ayanna Witter-Johnson, this is an uplifting concert filled with rich harmonies, beautiful lyrics, space for reflection and both sad, and funny stories.

"Brilliant trio ... sensational singers" (The Choir, BBC Radio 3) VOICE is an exciting, female vocal trio. In their years together, they have built a dedicated fan-base across the world; a rich, varied repertoire of their own arrangements, new commissions, and rarely performed Early Music; and they have honed a truly unique sound. Victoria, Clemmie, and Emily first began singing together in Oxford as members of the Oxford Girls' Choir, before going on to form the trio as well as forging their own successful, diverse careers. The first period instrument string quartet to be selected as BBC New Generation Artists, the CONSONE QUARTET are fast making a name for themselves with their honest and expressive interpretations of repertoire, notably from the classical and romantic eras. Formed at the Royal College of Music in London, the Consone Quartet launched their professional career in 2015, shortly after which they were awarded two prizes at the 2015 York Early Music International Young Artists Competition, including the EUBO Development Trust Prize and a place on the EEEmerging Scheme in France. They went on to win the 2016 Royal Over-Seas League Ensemble Prize, and in 2022 were awarded a prestigious Borletti-Buitoni Trust (BBT) fellowship.

We welcome the return of the quartet that has been enthusiastically received at London's major venues and UK festivals, as well as further afield in Europe. Consone are Artists-in-Residence at Paxton House (2023-2025) and at Saxon Shore Early Music Kenardington (2024-2027).
